Graduates!

It is an exciting time of year, as Maryland's public charter high schools are graduating students across the state. Public charter high schools are boosting high school graduation and college attendance rates statewide. Maryland has eight public charter high schools serving over 3,500 students. Five of these schools are in Baltimore City. In 2018, the average graduation rate for the Baltimore public charter schools was 80.9%, which is 8 points higher than the Baltimore City average and almost 17 points higher than the non-selective high school graduation rate of 64.2%. Selective criteria-based traditional schools had a high school graduation rate of 90.0%, only 9.1% higher than charter schools. Four Baltimore City Charter high schools had graduation rates over 81%.

Statewide, 2 of the 8 public charter schools graduated more than 95% of their senior classes! Great job!

The College Park Academy (CPA), a Prince George's County public charter school offering a rigorous college preparatory education for students in grades 6-12, is celebrating the graduation of its first senior class. The Class of 2019's 86 students walked the stage at the graduation ceremony taking place on the University of Maryland campus. Graduates have been offered admission and scholarships to a wide array of colleges and universities, from the University of Maryland, UMBC, and Johns Hopkins, to the University of Chicago and Penn State.
